

Supply Chain Risk Management

WHA Group maintains business relationships with suppliers who operate in a transparent, fair, comply with law, and they must adhere to the Suppliers Code of Conduct. Moreover, WHA Group has a policy to promote sustainable sourcing by collaborating with stakeholders across the supply chain, from raw material procurement to product delivery. For supplier selection, new suppliers seeking to collaborate with WHA Group are required to complete both of registration and supplier Pre-risk assessment via Pre-qualification form(PQ). This form includes questions that assess the supplier's qualifications in terms of quality, pricing, production capabilities, management systems, and sustainability potential (ESG) and include supplier performance assessment is required to monitor and track in our process. These processes are in WHA Corporate Procurement Management System (CPRS).

WHA has initiative digital transformation in each BU pass couple of years, especially Procurement operation has upgraded to be digital standard in procurement process in order to increase efficiency, transparency by creating "Corporate Procurement Management System(CPRS) to operate as online operation and able to communicate with venders conveniently such as of supplier registration, pre-risk assessment of quality and ESG and performance review automatically.

WHA has adopted the system of vendor list and supplier selection to ensure that suppliers deliver products and services that meet the company's requirements. Suppliers approved through the supplier selection process will be registered on the Approved Vendor List (AVL) in CPRS System by WHA's procurement staff. WHA Group evaluates supplier using Pre-Qualification and ESG Risk Self-Assessment in the selection process.












ESG Self Assessment and Onsite Audit

WHA Group defines supplier assessment who shall meet a minimum of 60% in order to pass WHA Group's ESG assessment. Suppliers who has score less than 25 percentage will be executed as WHA Improvement plan in time. If any supplier can not execute WHA will terminate such supplier from Bidding invitation and contracting within 1 year of improvement. The process ensure that WHA incorporate ESG performance in suppliers' selection which is to guarantee that sustainability is embedded into supplier selection and contract awarding.
